# Integrity Education Plan

# Air Sport Australia Confederation Integrity Education Plan 2022

## Introduction

Sport Integrity Australia is committed to working with all National Sporting Organisations (NSOs) to help increase their capability to mitigate and manage integrity threats to provide a safe, fair and healthy environment for participants at all levels of sport. NSOs must have policies that address issues relating to:

- Member protection;
- Child Safeguarding;
- Competition Manipulation & Sports Wagering;
- the Improper Use of Drugs and Medicine; and
- Complaint handling.

Sport Integrity Australia will support Air Sport Australia Confederation (ASAC) to plan, implement, and maintain an education strategy that incorporates material addressing integrity threats. To help ASAC implement and educate their members on integrity threats, this plan details all current available education resources and their target audiences. This is set out in detail in **Attachment A – Education Resources**.

NSOs should promote these education resources to the intended audiences within their sport.

Please note that at this stage all courses outlined in Attachment A are recommended, and not compulsory. Sport Integrity Australia will work with ASAC to further tailor this plan as the implementation of the National Integrity Framework evolves.

## Compliance

All Recognised NSOs are required to comply with obligations set out in the NSO Recognition agreement, specifically;

- As a recognised NSO, your organisation must provide education and awareness about integrity threats to your members and have in place an education plan.

Agreement with and promotion of the resources in this plan satisfies the above requirements.

## Review

The implementation of this plan will be reviewed in 2023, which will include setting mandatory education requirements for various cohorts.

## Conclusion

This Education Plan is in partnership with Sport Integrity Australia, who will support this plan through the provision of education resources and interventions. ASAC is responsible for implementing this plan within their sport. Through this plan, together we aim to reduce the risk of threats to ASAC members and uphold the integrity of sport.
