

Definition of Notable Events

A record that does not fit into a classification described in 4.5.1 of the Sporting Code may be recognised as a notable event at the discretion of the APF board.

Notable events

A record or event of significant interest that does not fall under any of the classifications described in 4.5.1 but is considered noteworthy.

Section 4.6 of the current sporting code (page 17) is the process for application for recognition of competition and performance records.

Applications for notable events should be accompanied by the following information.

- (a) The name, sex, residency or citizenship and sporting licence number of each participant*
- (b) The type of the ascent vehicles(s)*
- (c) Exit height*
- (d) Where the notable event took place*
- (e) Time and date of the performance record*
- (f) Chief judge's or CI's (or authorised delegate's) certification that the participants on the notable event were validated.*
- (g) DZ details including height above sea level*
- (h) For an event that requires judges, it should be verified by at least 3 APF or internationally qualified judges in accordance with section 4.1.3, excepting that in place of an onsite judge, a CI (or authorised delegate) may verify that the event was done in accordance with the plan.*
