Subject Matter and Applicability	MILITARY PARACHUTES DE FRANCE BT80 CANOPIES
	1. It has come to our attention that a military Parachutes de France BT80 main canopy had been recovered and fitted to a Vector tandem parachute system. This particular BT80 canopy has now been returned, however, there is a possibility that other canopies might be used in a similar manner.
	2. You will be aware that the standard civilian BT80 variant is authorised by the BPA for use as a tandem canopy, however, the military variant is heavily modified and completely unsuitable for civilian parachuting.
	3. The drogue pilot-chute modification is designed to reduce the opening forces when deployed at high altitude. Therefore, if deployed at the normal tandem deployment height of 5000ft AGL, military BT80 canopies will open extremely slowly, thereby, compromising the safety of the tandem instructor and passenger.
	4. The following features identify military BT80 canopies:
	a. The drogue pilot-chute bridle-line passes through the canopy and attaches to the slider.
	b. There are no cross-port vents.
	c. The canopy is a silver grey colour.
